### **§ 6.04.010 DOG: LICENSE REQUIRED.**

Dogs must be licensed in accord with state and county laws.

### **§ 6.04.020 DOG: NUISANCE WHEN.**

A dog is a nuisance if it:

(A) Howls or barks in such a manner as to deprive a person unreasonably of peace and quiet;

(B) Is upon property not owned by or under the control or custody of the owner or custodian of the dog.

### **§ 6.04.030 ANIMALS AT LARGE DECLARED UNLAWFUL.**

(A) No person may permit an animal or bird owned or controlled by him or her to be at large within the city.

(B) ***AT LARGE*** means for the animal or bird to be off the premises of the owner or custodian and not under control of the owner or custodian either by leash, cord, chain or otherwise legally controlled.

### **§ 6.04.040 PRESUMPTION OF OWNERSHIP.**

For the purpose of this chapter, any person who keeps feeds or permits animals to habitually be upon his or her premises shall be presumed to be the owner of such animal.

**§ 6.04.050 ANIMALS AT LARGE: IMPOUNDMENT.**

It is lawful for any police officer to take up any animal found at large in the city or to be a nuisance in violation of this chapter and deliver such animal to the custody of the animal control officer of Jackson County to be disposed of and dealt with according to law.

**§ 6.04.060 CARCASS REMOVAL.**

No person shall permit any animal or fowl carcass owned by him or her or under his or her control to remain upon the public streets or places or be exposed on private property for a period of time longer than is reasonably necessary to remove or dispose of such carcass.

**§ 6.04.070 VIOLATION: PENALTY.**

Any person convicted of a violation of this chapter shall be punished upon such conviction by a fine of not less than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars or more than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars.
